

### As readers and reporters we will:

- Learning to write a diary entry. We will be writing from the perspective of 'Om' one of the characters from our books 'Stone age boy'. We read the book from the boys perspective, having landed in the stone age but we will be re-writing it whilst imagining what it might have been like for her to show him around. We will be using skills such as writing in first person, exclamation sentences, apostrophes to mark plural possession, sequencing in chronological order, grouping into paragraphs. fronted adverbials and expressing time, place and cause using conjunctions, adverbs, or prepositions.

### As mathematicians we will:

- Learn multiplication and division facts for multiples 0-12,
- Learn different written methods for both multiplication and division,
- Identify and use efficient multiplication methods,
- Multiply and divide by 10,100,1 and 0, and 2 and 3-digit numbers by 1 digit numbers.
- Know all of our factor pairs.
- Understand and calculate equivalent lengths, Area and perimeter,
- Measure, add and subtract length.
- Recognise fractions including equivalent fractions
- Add and subtract, compare and order and calculate fractions of an amount.


### As scientists and engineers we will:

### As computer scientists we will:

- develop our understanding of digital devices, with an initial focus on inputs, processes, and outputs.
- compare digital and non-digital devices.
- be introduced to computer networks, including devices that make up a network's infrastructure, such as wireless access points and switches.
- we will discover the benefits of connecting devices in a network.
